As a member of the Tri-River Historical Museum Network, our museum will participate in their Spring Into the Past event held annually the first weekend in May when most members are open the same days and hours. This year's theme is "Notable Names" and we're showcasing names of prominent people and public places in our community. Local buildings or streets might bear their name — or even the community itself!

Most museums are open Saturday, May 4 from 11 am to 5 pm and Sunday, May 5 from 1 to 5 pm. (Exceptions: Ionia and Vestaburg only open on Sunday, Freeport only on Saturday)

museum volunteers, both spouses of museum board members.






